

Advocacy Internship (Fall 2021)

Franciscans International is an international non-governmental organization, with general consultative status at the United Nations, working for the promotion, protection, and respect of human rights. Since its establishment in 1989, FI has used advocacy as a tool to combat and curb human rights abuses. FI relies on the expertise and first-hand information of a large network of partners, including Franciscans working with the most marginalized and disadvantaged individuals and groups in societies. From its offices in Geneva and New York, FI works together with grassroots movements and national and international civil society organizations to advocate for structural changes addressing the root causes of injustice. FI promotes human rights at the heart of all policies and processes in the areas of development, environment and peace.

Internship description:

- Assisting with monitoring of General Assembly and Security Council sessions, and preparation and monitoring of the UN Human Rights Council, UPR and Treaty Body sessions;
- Assisting in drafting and proof-reading reports and documents to various UN human rights mechanisms;
- Contributing to on-going FI research projects;
- Providing support in the organisation of workshops and trainings;
- Providing administrative and logistical assistance
- Any other assistance to the advocacy team.

Candidate profile and other requirements:

- Fluency in English, both written and oral. Fluency in Spanish will be considered an asset;
- Proficiency in reporting, analysis, and synthesis;
- University degree in international human rights law, political science, international relations or other related disciplines;
- Some knowledge of the UN human rights mechanisms;
- Good organisation skills and ability to work under pressure;
- Able to adapt to various situations (flexibility and adaptability in a multicultural environment), highly motivated and dynamic;
- Capable of working both autonomously and in a team.

FI offers:

- A real learning experience: the intern will have to carry out required tasks in due time in a professional way as an effective support to the FI Advocacy Programme; at the same time FI will commit to providing the intern with appropriate supervision as well as opportunities for practical learning and gaining meaningful experience in human rights advocacy and research work;
- Working as part of a committed and nice team;
- Opportunity to contribute to developing the organisation;
- Monetary compensation (700 USD per month if full time).



To note:

- Location: FI office in New York; however, due to the current COVID situation, it is likely that you will work remotely.
- Period: Starting in September for six months if part-time (If you can start earlier, please indicate your availability). Ending date may be negotiable.
- Working time: part-time 50% (or full time upon mutual agreement).

How to apply:

- Applications should contain: a CV and a 1-page (max.) letter of motivation. Please indicate in your application whether you are looking for a part-time or full-time internship.
- Applications should be in English;
- Deadline for submission of applications 1 August 2021.

Interviews are expected to be conducted in the first week of August, and the official start day of the internship will be the 1st of September (or earlier depending on availability of the candidate and upon mutual agreement).
